Online & on-site MCMF afternoon concert at De Doelen in Rotterdam in collaboration with Nordwestdeutsche Philharmonie, Herford, conducted by Martin Haunhorst

On Sunday September 27th, 2020, Melles Classical Music Foundation (MCMF) again organizes a concert in the main concert hall of De Doelen in Rotterdam. A limited number of seats may be available due to the Covid-19 protocol, and for that reason **the concert will be broadcasted online via www.MCMFrotterdam.com.**

What does the program bring this year? We will start with 'La Symphonie des Hauts Talons', ie. 'The High Heels Symphony'. Recently, the medical team of Melles Cornea Clinic was enforced with a French eye doctor, who stands firm on wearing high heels under all circumstances. In the MCMF Situation Room, a strategy was designed to further analyze this fashion trend, which resulted in a musical composition that focusses on various aspects of the phenomenon.

The first movement expresses the locomotion of a woman wearing high heels and how the holistic motion is perceived by the casual bystander. The second movement reflects the esthetics from a graphic perspective, by having the notes arranged according to the shape of the pumps: a high note (the heel) followed by a string of lower notes (the sole), or vice versa if the other foot is considered. The third movement reflects the distracting sound of high heels clicking with an irregular pulse, suggesting the ever imminent threat of one heel flopping sidewards. The last movement considers the deep

psychological La Symphonie des Hauts Talons and philosophical effects, the power a woman must feel while walking on high heels and how it translates into her attitude: how do heels make the Violin II owner transcend to higher spheres?



The second piece is a Concertino for Horn and we are grateful that Felix Peijnenborgh is again willing to play the horn solo. Last but not least, Ravel's Piano Concert is of course played by Tobias Haunhorst.

For online attendees: How does it work?

Owing to the Covid-19 pandemic, the concert hall capacity will be limited by the governmental guidelines. Hence, it will probably not be possible to welcome you all in the Main Hall of De Doelen.

However, to have access to the concert from your own living room, the entire MCMF concert will be broadcasted online via a 'live-stream'. This means that you can watch the concert from your iPad, tablet, mobile telephone or computer. An internet connection and/or wifi is required and the overall sound of the concert will probably be better when you are using earphones or headphones. You can watch the concert at the MCMF website, the MCMF Facebook page, or the MCMF YouTube-channel.

How to get access? Register via www.MCMFrotterdam.com and choose 'Registration' in the upper banner. Submit your personal data and one week before the concert, you will receive via e-mail the required 'links' to log-in. If online registration would not work out, please use the response form on the flip side of this brochure, and we will send you the log-in links via e-mail.
